Long live the King, who would have been 75 on Friday. In tribute, here are **75 GEMS** you should know about him

f you're a real Elvis Presley fan, you knew well before the coverage of his upcoming birthday that he would have turned 75 on Friday. The celebration will be marked by tribute concerts, movie marathons, book releases and more, proving that The King is still king.

You also probably know that Presley was a twin, that Priscilla was only 14 when she met her future husband and that he liked fried peanut butter and banana sandwiches. Here are 75 things that you may not have known about him.

Elvis is Norse for "all wise."

Presley almost died in a Tupelo, Miss., tornado when he was 15 months old.

Research shows that "Elvis" is one of the most popular passwords for computers. When Presley was 2, he

wiggled out of his mother's grip and joined the choir to sing during an Assembly of God Church service.

When he was 10, he sang "Old Shep" during a children's talent show. He finished fifth.

At 11, Presley got a guitar. He really wanted a bicycle (some say a rifle), but his parents couldn't afford it.

Once a boy he was wrestling with broke a hip.

The first time Presley recorded, it was for his mother. He paid \$4 to Sun Studio to press two songs — "My Happiness" and "That's When Your Heartaches Begin" - as a gift for her.

Presley recorded anywhere from 600 to 1,200 songs, depending on whether the list includes unfinished works, alternate versions, bootlegged recordings, etc.

After Presley's first TV appearance in 1956, Jackie Gleason said, "The kid has no right behaving like a sex maniac on a national show."

Parents got freaked out, too. On Long Island, a 14-year-old girl told the press: "My parents locked up my Elvis records, and my father broke my record player."

Sometimes, Presley would sign autographs on fans' breasts — "Elvis" on the left and "Presley" on the right.

In 1965, Presley talked about entering a monastery. 15 Presley started wearing a chai necklace because his mother Gladys' maternal grandmother was Jewish — the reason why he added a Star of David on his mother's grave-

stone in the mid-1960s. When asked why he wore the necklace, he said, "I

Presley's movie idol was Tony Curtis, who had black shiny hair.

efore we completely leave the Aughts behind, the time seems right to salute Long Island's MVPs in the decade, successes to shoot

for in the new decade. According to Billboard's decade-end issue, here are the Long Island scene's biggest winners in the Aughts: MARIAH CAREY The Greenlawn native's "We Belong Together" was the decade's biggest single, and her album "The Emancipation of Mimi" ended up as the 27th biggest album, putting her at No. 11 on the list of biggest artists in the decade. **BILLY JOEL** Though he didn't


release any new pop material in The Aughts, his touring success didn't waver. Joel was the 10thbiggest touring artist of the decade, playing for 4.1 million people over 241 shows, 213 of which sold out, and grossing \$418.4 million. His 12 sellouts at Madison Square Garden in 2006 made up the 15th highest-grossing run of the decade, grossing \$19.2 million.

ASHANTI The Glen Cove native's "Foolish" was No. 19 on the Aughts' singles chart, while her duet with Ja Rule, "Always on Time" finished at No. 82. Her debut "Ashanti" finished at No. 101 on the decade's biggestalbum chart, making her the No. 41 artist overall.

JENNIFER LOPEZ and **MARC ANTHONY** Brookville's power couple also did well. Lopez fielded two singles - "I'm Real" (No. 30), "Ain't It Funny" (No. 62) — and two albums, "J.Lo" (No. 87) and "This Is Me... Then" (No. 189), on the decadeend charts, finishing as the No. 27 artist overall. Anthony scored two albums on the top Latin Albums charts, "Desde un Principio" (No. 15) and "Libre" (No. 16).
